This week students enjoyed tall tales about John Henry, Casey Jones, Paul Bunyan, and Pecos Bill. Next week we will start a science unit on solids, liquids, and gases.

Spelling

Students are bringing home the **Unit 1 List 1** spelling list today to practice for homework. We will have a test on these spelling patterns next Friday, September 29. It will be a "practice" test, to help students become more familiar with the routine of studying spelling.

Students will also bring home some practice pages in a dry erase sleeve. One side provides clues about how to break the words down into each individual sound. It also gives clues about

how many letters spell each sound. We have completed the same practice sheet at school, and it is very helpful for practicing at home.

When your child feels more confident, have them flip the dry erase sleeve over and try quizzing them on the words on the side with no clues.

It is also helpful if you challenge your child to spell additional words that follow the same spelling patterns as the words on the list, so that they are focusing on learning the spelling patterns, rather than just memorizing a list.

Saying a sentence aloud that has one or two spelling words, and having your child listen and write the sentence is also very helpful.
